

Task 1 for course credits and grading

Submit until 6 November 2018 (later submission = worse grade)

Recommended date of submission: 30.10.2018

1. Explore three or more language documentations in two or more publicly accessible archives (such as given on slide 23 of the presentation 16.10.).
2. Write a report which includes:
 - **Short** information about **two documentations** (language, what is documented, when, by whom, where archived...).
 - **Detailed** information about **one documentation**; critically discuss its strong and weak sides on the basis of what you learned about language documentation in the first three lectures and from the texts by Berge, Himmelmann and Johnson. The chosen documentation must contain **spoken** language data.
 - **Detailed** information about **at least one session/recording** of the chosen documentation. Attention: you may need to have ELAN or Annotation Pro installed on your computer to view it.

Always try to use your own words and structure (“copy-paste” is bad, allowable only in small amounts and using quotation marks).

Your result should cover 2-3 typed pages. You have deliver the report **both printed** out on paper (deliver in class) and **as PDF** (send by e-mail to the teacher). No other formats will be accepted.
