

Conditions for passing and grading

All students are required to do and submit the following:

1. Read the chapter on research questions by Jane Sunderland, answer questions about it and formulate two research questions about any topic of your choice. Those who did not participate in the first classes have to either submit this task in written form or give their answers to me during office hours.
2. Present a research paper (not your own) that reports about some empirical research in linguistics. You should briefly state: its topic and goal, its research question(s), investigated material, methods used, results. Those who did not present a paper in class in 2019 have to submit this in written form (1-2 pages) AND answer my questions about it during office hours.

3. Submit a description of your own (possible) project (for your MA thesis), containing:
 - The topic, a possible title (can be changed later), and – if you know it – the name of your supervisor
 - A short description of the goal, research questions, materials, methods
 - A bibliography with a minimum of 3 references that concern this topic directly and 5 references for the wider context

1-2 pages, submit in print and as PDF.
